
Help us applaud these students' accomplishments and support their continued hard work defying the odds with care packages! Each student will receive a special package full of college essentials and goodies.


# Art Exhibit: Josephine Gerweck October


# <u>Little Listeners (ages 3–5yrs)</u> Monday, October 17, 1:30–2:00

### Tot Time (ages 2–3yrs) Tuesday, October 18, 9:30-10:00


Read More/Register

# Newbies (birth-15mo) Tuesday, October 18, 10:45-11:30




#### Read More/Register

# Grow Play Learn (birth-5yrs) Wednesday, October 19, 9:30-10:30





Friday, October 21, 9:30-10:00




#### Read More/Register
