
Help us applaud these students' accomplishments and support their continued hard work defying the odds with care packages! Each student will receive a special package full of college essentials and goodies.

## Art Exhibit: Josephine Gerweck October



### <u>Little Listeners (ages 3–5yrs)</u>


Monday, October 24, 1:30-2:00

participants will be able to take their pumpkin home.


## Tot Time (ages 2-3yrs) Tuesday, October 25, 9:30-10:00
