Monday, December 19, 9:30–11:00



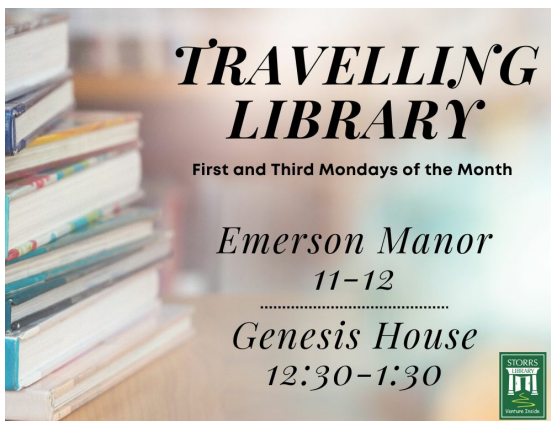
You're invited to join the Weekly Writing Group!

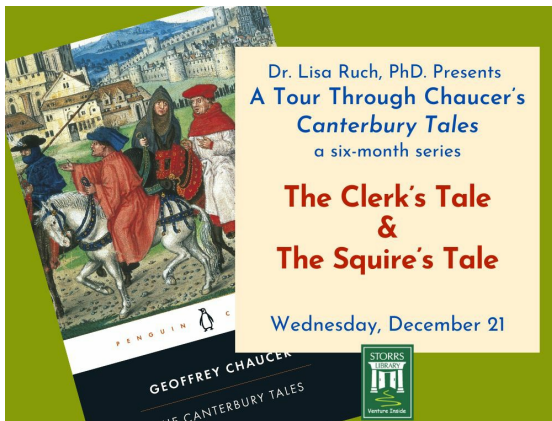
