



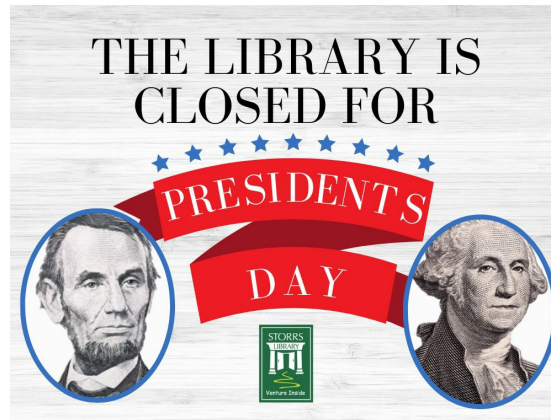

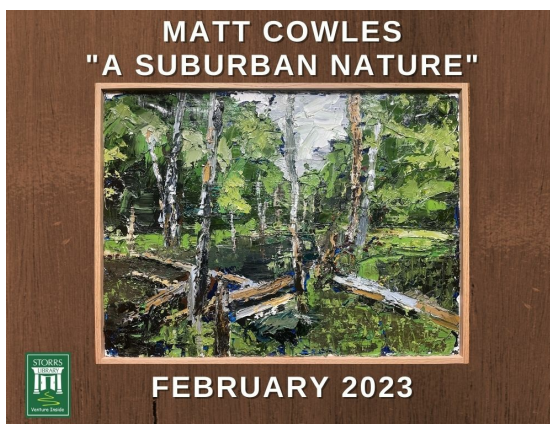


The Library will be closed on Monday, February 20 for Presidents' Day.

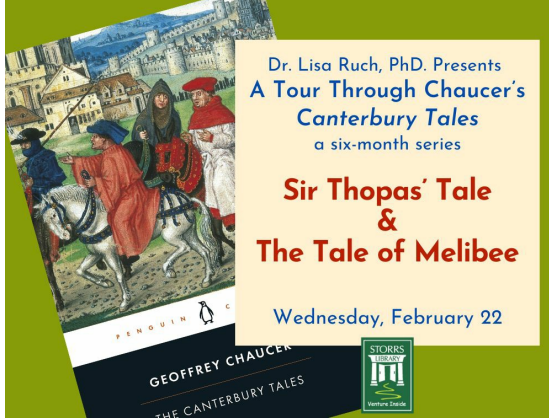

Thursday, February 23, 6:00–7:30



Great Decisions is America's largest discussion program on world affairs, examining and informing on the most critical global issues facing America today. It helps to serve as a catalyst for developing awareness, understanding, and informed opinion on U.S. foreign policy and global issues. Through its balanced, nonpartisan programs and publications, the program encourages citizens to participate in the foreign policy process.

Topic 3 : CHINA AND THE U.S. - For the past ten years, the United States and China have been locked in a competition for who has the greatest global influence. One major point of contention is the status of Taiwanese sovereignty, which has become even more relevant recently with the possibility that Russia's invasion of Ukraine may prompt China to take similar action regarding Taiwan. How will the United States engage a China which is increasingly seeking to expand its sphere of influence?
