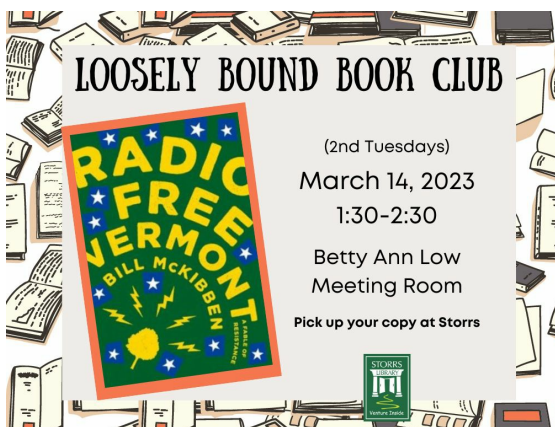

Ideal for the beginner, with no experience necessary. Gariné Arakelian of Kulina Folk Art will discuss colors and how to blend them in a successful manner using a permanent, high chroma, highly transparent liquid fabric paint. Instructions will be given for a step-by-step "tie dye style" creative process and each participant will go home with a beautiful, wearable creation. At the end of the workshop, each participant will take home their scarf and allow it to dry overnight. Once the piece is dry, it can be ironed on the silk setting to permanently set the colors. The scarf is 100% silk with a hand-rolled (hand-sewn) hem.

It is recommended to bring an old shirt to protect your clothing. Please register in advance.

March's book selection is *Radio Free Vermont* by Bill McKibben

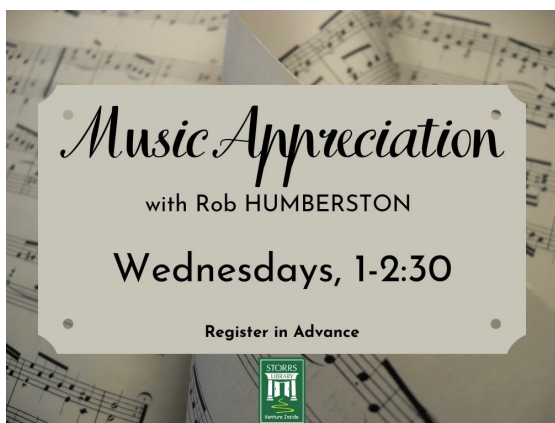

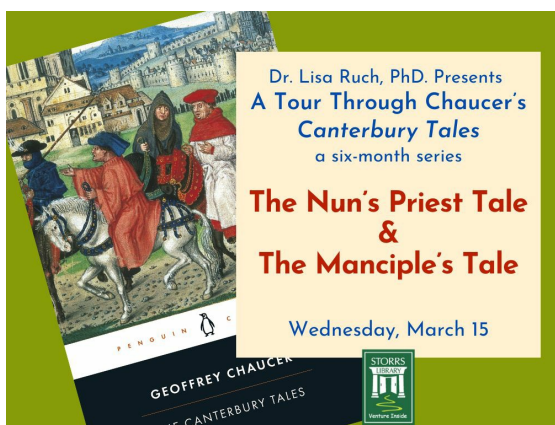

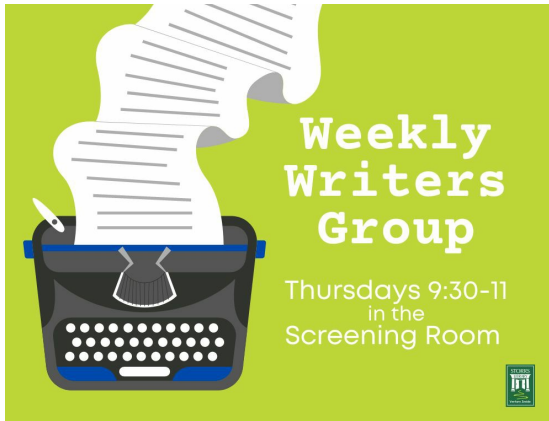

Thursday, March 16, 9:30–11:00



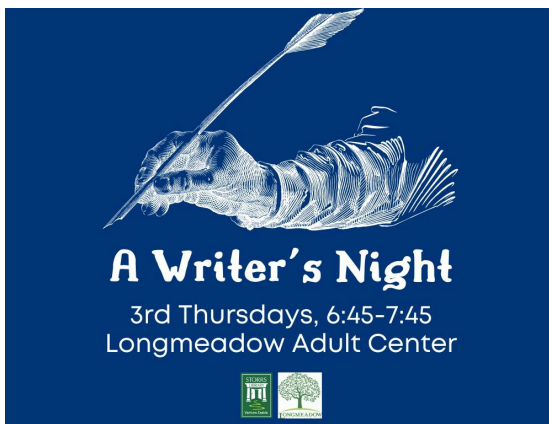
You're invited to join the Weekly Writing Group!
