Low Vision Support Group Monday, May 8, 1:00-3:00





Mary Margaret O'Connell, Lowell Mill Girl Reenactment

Sharon KENNEDY will speak directly to the audience in her portraval of "Mary Margaret O'CONNELL: Lowell Mill Girl,1847." Mary Margaret began working in the Lowell Mills at age 15. Her parents immigrated from Ireland and settled in "the Acre" in Lowell. She describes details of her life: chasing pigs through the streets, the empty flour barrel her father used building a chimney for their little house, her mother's work washing floors in the big Yankee houses "across the bridge," etc. Travel with us to another time through another life with Sharon KENNEDY's Lowell Mill Girl.

Have you ever wondered where the wildlife habitats in Longmeadow are, and what makes them ecologically important? Now you can find out. The Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife and the Nature Conservancy Massachusetts created an online tool and resource to help identify our critical land and waterways throughout all of Massachusetts. And here in Longmeadow, we have an abundance of habitats that support rare wildlife and plant species and help make our town more climate resilient.

In this workshop, you will learn about this comprehensive approach to mapping our ecosystems and landscapes. You'll find out where our most critical habitats are and how you can help inform yourselves and the town in making important local decisions about land use and protection. This workshop will cover what's new with BioMap, include a live demonstration on how to use this resource, and allow for questions and answers from two BioMap outreach specialists.
