

Youth Programs


Summertime Storytime (ages 3–5) Monday, July 17, 10:30–11:30

Youth Chess (gr K+) Monday, July 17, 3:15-4:15




Read More/Register

Join our 2nd-3rd grade book group where we'll explore books that draw readers in from the very first line. Each month we'll enjoy a page-turning chapter book and




meet to discuss what kept us turning those pages. This month's book selection is *A Boy Called Bat* by Elena K. Arnold.



Wednesday, July 19, 3:15-3:45




Read More/Register


