

needs of grieving children and teens; and review a wide range of resources including books, websites, and activities.

Shelly Bathe Lenn, M.Ed., CAGS is the Bereavement Coordinator for Cooley Dickinson VNA & Hospice. Ms. Lenn has worked with grieving children and their families since 2002 at The Garden: A Center for Grieving Children and Teens in Northampton where she leads groups, trains and supervises group facilitators, and consults with families, individuals, school districts, clinicians, and pediatricians about all issues related to grief and loss. She plans and leads all bereavement programming for Cooley Dickinson Hospice. Additionally, Ms. Lenn is the Bereavement Specialist for the Massachusetts Center for Unexpected Infant and Child Death at Boston Medical Center. She consults with families and clinicians, speaks on panels at statewide trainings, and attends quarterly Child Fatality Review Team meetings across Massachusetts. She lives in Longmeadow and is a mom, runner, and swimmer.

Following the completion of a year of his Music Appreciation program, Rob Humberston returns for another year of musical listening and exploration by way of his personal collection of recordings built over five decades. 



The Longmeadow Adult Center and Straw Dog Writers Guild is delighted to present "A Writer's Night."

Justine Dymond's short story collection *The Emigrant and Other Stories* (Sowilo Press) won the 2018 Eludia Award from Hidden Rivers Arts. Other awards and honors include a 2020 Mass Cultural Council finalist grant, second place in the New South prose writing contest for her memoir about breast cancer "Brave of Worms," a 2007 O. Henry Prize, a "distinguished" story in The Best American Short Stories 2006. two Pushcart Prize nominations and a nomination for The Best American Travel Writing. Her stories have appeared in Pleiades, The Massachusetts Review, The Briar Cliff Review, Meat for Tea, Lowestoft Chronicle, and Cargo Literary. Demeter Press issued her co-edited collection Motherhood Memoirs: Mothers *Creating/Writing Lives* in 2013. She has been honored with grants and residencies from the Vermont Studio Center, Writers OMI at Ledig House, and Martha's Vineyard Institute of Creative Writing. On faculty in the department of Literature, Writing, & Journalism at Springfield College since 2008, she is currently working on a novel tentatively titled "Upper Crust."
