Wednesday, November 1 – Thursday, November 30

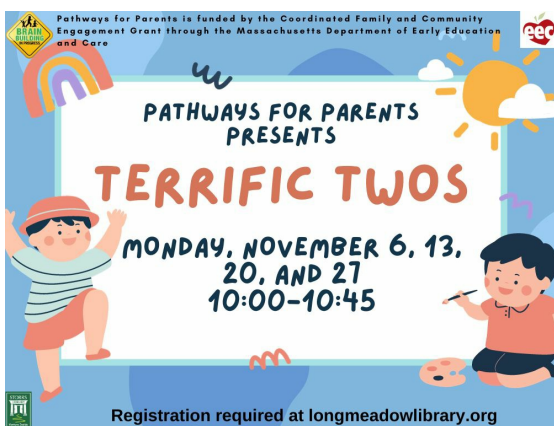

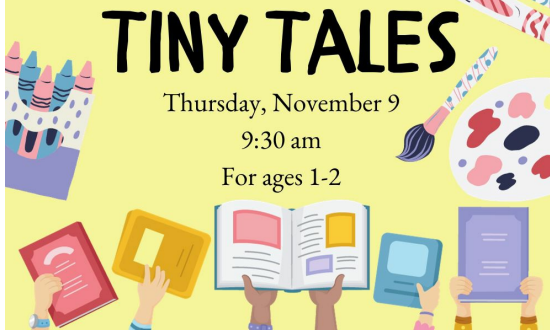
