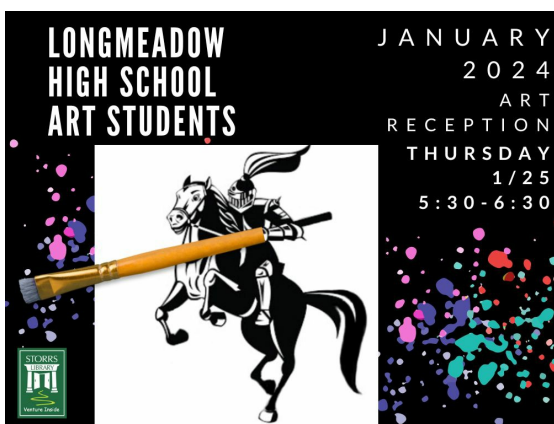

A reception will take place on January 25th from 5:30-6:30 PM.

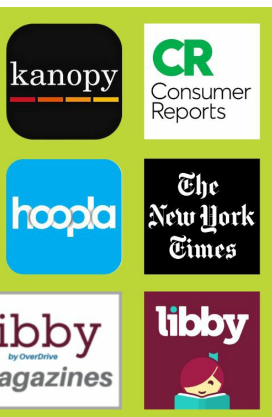

Author Talk with Fred Sokol

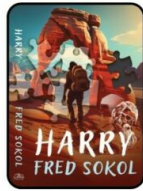

Fred Sokol is Professor Emeritus at Asnuntuck Community College having taught theater, film, and literature. Additionally, he wrote theater commentary for The Springfield Republican for twenty-five years. These days he reviews professional theater, covering Connecticut and the Berkshires, for the website Talkin' Broadway.

Sokol is co-author of the book *Muses in Arcadia: Cultural Life in the Berkshires*. An arts journalist, he has reviewed more than 2500 plays and has interviewed such artists as Idina Menzel, Mandy Patinkin, and Susan Sarandon. He was the founding editor of The Connecticut Quarterly, and published, in 2011, his novel Mendel and Morris. The sequel novel, *Destiny*, was published by Bellastoria Press, in August 2020.

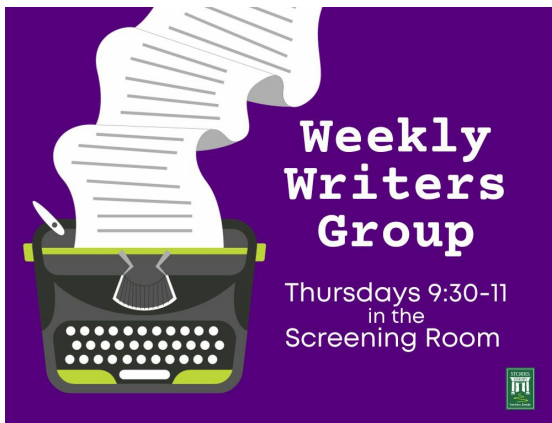
